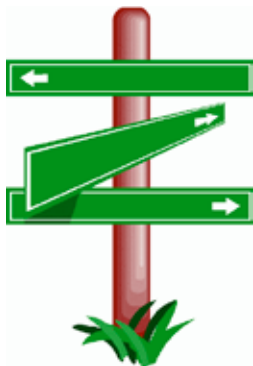
Summer Pests:



The **mosquito** months are coming and it's tough to enjoy your yard when they're constantly buzzing around your ears. Here are some common, and less common, tips to keeping their numbers down and level of summer fun up!

1. It goes without saying that cleaning your gutters is one of the top ways to minimize mosquito breeding grounds.
2. In addition to gutters, be sure to regularly treat pools and ornamental ponds. In addition, change the water in any bird baths or baby pools, at least, twice a week.
3. If standing water is available it will be used. Drill holes in the bottom of garbage cans, recycle bins, tire swings or other items where water might collect.
4. While we don't promote treating outdoor areas with harsh chemicals there are natural oil-based products that can be purchased at hardware stores that can be moderately affective especially when teamed with other good lawn care practices.
5. Keep your lawn well maintained. Not only does it look nice but helps control a number of many pest, including mosquitos, and keep their numbers down.
6. Put up or dry off any children toys in your yard.
7. Most people have heard of citronella but instead of buying candles try planting some in your yard. In addition, the following plants can be equally as helpful – marigolds, catnip, basil and lavender.

It only takes 24-48 hours for mosquito eggs to hatch so don't put off protecting your yard or you might find yourself inside on a beautiful day.



Street Signs:

Just an update on the new signage. Our new signs look great, but unfortunately some of them were put in incorrectly. We are holding the sign company accountable and any leaning or twisted signs should be fixed soon.

We've contracted a separate company to add a couple additional **NO LITTERING** signs and ask the residents observe the city speed limit. We're adding additional hours to our police budget to further crack down on these two issues.

Code Enforcement:

TIPS FOR MOWING SEASON It's that time of year to fertilize your yard, dust off your lawn mower, and get ready for the mowing and growing season. As you mow, please remember to direct grass clippings back toward your lawn and away from streets, driveways and sidewalks. Growing grass benefits from all the great nutrients found in lawn clippings. Clippings left on impervious surfaces are washed down the storm drain and into the closest creek or stream. Once there, nature works to decompose the grass clippings, and while doing so, depletes the oxygen in water which fish and plants need to survive. Keeping grass clippings off of the street and sidewalks is a simple thing we can all do to keep our city clean and beautiful. Happy Spring and happy mowing!
