
Still have items to dispose of that is not included in your curbside service? No problem.

Louisville Metro Public Works Department has the solution!

The Public Works recycling service has a location at 7501 Grade Lane with operating hours of Tuesday-Saturday from 9:30am - 4pm where you can take any of the below listed items to be properly disposed of. Joining in to make this environment a safe and clean place is part of our responsibilities and when we all pitch in, we all win!

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS SITE:

- Asbestos floor tiles (less than 25 lbs.)
- Automotive fluids
- Batteries (auto, household and rechargeables)
- Cleaners (bathroom, rug, upholstery, all-purpose spot removers)
- Driveway sealers
- Fertilizers
- Fire extinguishers
- Fluorescent light bulbs & LED light bulbs
- Freon
- Furniture polishes and waxes
- Gasoline (including boat gas)
- Hearing aid/watch batteries
- Kerosene
- Lawn/garden hazardous chemicals (container must be left at HazBin)
- Mercury thermometers, thermostats and light bulbs
- Metal polishes and rust removers
- Mildew removers
- Mineral spirits/turpentine
- Mothballs
- Nail polish and removers
- Oil based paint or lead paint
- Oven and drain cleaners
- Pesticides, herbicides, fungicides, insecticides (container must be left at HazBin)
- Propane tanks (1 lb. and 20 lb. grill tanks)
- Smoke detectors
- Solvents and degreasers
- Swimming pool chemicals
- Varnishes and stains
- Wood preservatives



ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

- Items from businesses
- Containers larger than 5 gallons or 40 pounds
- More than 25 lbs. of Asbestos

Continued reminders, please heed. . .

Etiquette: As a courtesy to your neighbors, please place bins curbside at or after 3pm on the evening prior. As a courtesy to Rumpke, please ensure that your bins are curbside the evening prior, they are often in the city before 6am. Bins are also to be removed from the curb by end of the day of service.

Big Item Pick Up: Call Rumpke directly to schedule large item pickups, or Ms. Fawver, our Sanitation Commissioner. Please follow our 3pm curbside day prior etiquette for large items.

Neighborly Spring/Summer Ways

The board asks that you attend to these things as they are the most noticed, common complaints brought to the attention of the Commissioning Board.

- 1. Lawn Care** (grass height, grass clippings): Keeping your lawn trim and neat is a service to the whole city; it helps with pest control, especially mosquitoes when it is wet. Keeping grass clippings off the walk ways especially goes "unnoticed" by your neighbors.
- 2. Side Yard Maintenance:** Take a moment to peer at your trees, shrubs, flowers, and bushes from your neighbors' prospective. Your neighbors next door will especially appreciate the consideration.
- 3. Storm drains** (if you live near a drain): Rain, rain, and more rain. If you live near a storm drain your help keeping it clear from debris helps to ensure proper drainage when it pours. The entire City thanks you!
- 4. Have fun but remember quiet hours:** Dogs and fireworks, music and kids. If possible, warn your neighbors when you plan to be celebrating so that they can plan accordingly.
- 5. Dogs:** While you may feel that they are safe and friendly your neighbors may not know your dog like you do, or maybe their dogs or children have had a bad experience with dogs. Please while walking or letting your dog out keep them leashed or under your full control.

Code Enforcement:

While it is encouraged to first speak with your neighbors regarding your concerns; requests can be made online to our code enforcement officer, George Stewart, www.loucodes.com or please join us on the 3rd Tuesday of every month to submit your request in person.

Easy Spring/Summer Curb Appeal Updates

- 1.** Add big, bold house numbers. An easy and quick update, but most certainly will be noticed from the street. Well placed, bold numbers also help emergency personnel.
- 2.** Paint the front door. Remember to look up how to pick the best colors for your home.
- 3.** Add fresh porch furniture, flowers, or a seasonal wreath. These little updates really go a long way.
- 4.** Trim overgrown bushes and trees. Everyone notices a good haircut, cutting back overgrowth will be the same for your house.

Newspaper Publication Requirements:

Effective July 1st, 2018 House Bill 487 changed the publication requirements for certain cities. The City of Rolling Hills publishing requirements for ordinances, audits and bid solicitations have changed as a result of this bill. Publications you are accustomed to finding in the mail are now available in full on our website: Our new Budget amendment ordinance and the City's financial audit statement can be viewed in entirety at www.cityofrollinghillssky.com

HB487, Section 143: Publishing requirements: Notwithstanding KRS83A.060, 91A.040, Chapter 424, a county containing a population of more than 90,000 or any city within a county containing a population of more than 90,000, as determined by the 2010 US Census, may publish enacted ordinances, audits and bid solicitations by posting the full ordinances, the full audit report including the auditors opinion letter, or the bid solicitations on an internet web site maintained by the county or city government for a period of at least one year. If a county or city publishes ordinances, audits, or bid solicitations on an internet web site, the county or city shall also publish an advertisement in a newspaper qualified in accordance with KRS 424.120, with a description of the ordinances, audits, or bid solicitations published on the internet web site, including the Uniform Resource Locator (URL) where the documents can be viewed.
